

Dip Products Usage Instructions

Firstly, inspect the vehicle and identify any excessively dirty areas, this may include bugs on the front, a build up of road dust on the rear or tree sap / bird mess on the roof. They require the cleaning power of:

DIP PREP

Spray Dip Prep onto the affected areas, leave to work, pre-wet a microfibre cloth with a spray of Dip Prep and then wipe away. Next is to clean the entire bodywork with:

DIP CLEANER

Clean a panel at a time, applying a few sprays of Dip Cleaner to the surface, pre-wet a microfibre cloth with a spray of Dip Cleaner and then wipe the area to remove the dirt. With another clean, dry microfibre cloth, buff the cleaned area to give a slick finish. Continue with the same procedure around the vehicle, cleaning the windows and mirrors in the same way as you go.

To increase the longevity of protection and scratch resistance, the next step is:

DIP PROTECT

Now that the vehicle is clean, apply a few sprays of Dip Protect onto a clean microfibre cloth, not directly onto the vehicle. Gently rub the cloth on the panel's surface to apply Dip Protect and then, with another clean microfibre cloth, buff to a slick protected finish.

You can also apply Dip Protect to the windows for excellent rain repellency.

Don't forget to treat your wheels, tyres and trim with:

DIP REVIVE

If the wheels and tyres are excessively dirty, first treat with Dip Prep to remove stubborn brake dust and tar. Then spray the tyre surface with Dip Revive and do the same with the wheel. Leave Dip Revive on the tyre surface to nourish the tyre and dry off, meanwhile wipe the wheel with a microfibre cloth to clean. Pre-wet a microfibre cloth with a few sprays of Dip Revive and wipe once around the tyre to leave a deep black and fresh finish. Use the same procedure on trim and bumpers to clean and revitalise.

If you have dark coloured dip that looks like it needs a new lease of life, spray Dip Revive onto the affected area and allow to soak in, then just dab any excess away with a microfibre cloth; this will bring it back to a freshly applied look.
